COVID-19 Vaccine Side Effect Information

Independent living residents will receive a COVID-19 Vaccine side effect handout at Thursday's vaccination clinic. Common side effects include, but are not limited to:

- Soreness at injection site
- Headaches
- Low-grade fever, under 100 degrees
- Aches and fatigue
- Malaise-general feeling of discomfort
- Chills

If you have symptoms attributable to the vaccine such as achiness, headache or low-grade fever, it is okay to take ibuprofen or acetaminophen to reduce symptoms, if these medications are safe for you to take. If you have been evaluated by a physician regarding a known or potential allergic reaction and advised to take a specific medication, please follow that guidance.
